Sometimes called the "Grand Canyon of the Mojave," this is a good spot for bird and wildlife viewing. Kit Carson, Jedediah Smith, & John Charles Fremont are some of the early western explorers who passed through the area. The historic Mojave Road is nearby.</p> <p>The <u>Route 66 Mother Road Museum</u> in Barstow has numerous books for sale in its gift shop on areas to explore such as canyons, rock formations, intaglios, etc.</p>	35 miles	<p>After you purchase your books at the museum gift shop. The Crater is on BLM land, and has a graded dirt road leading to the base of the crater. Hiking trail leads to top of crater; allow 2-3 hours round trip to hike. Picnic tables and vault toilets are available. Best times to view: during spring wildflower bloom, early morning, or late afternoon.</p> <p>Historic Roy's Café is a 1940s café, 1930s motel, and gas station on historic Route 66. Numerous photo shoots have been done in Amboy.</p> <p>In April 2005, Albert Okura, founder of the Juan Pollo restaurants, purchased the town of Amboy, along with Roy's Café, motel, and gas station. In the 1880s, 20-Mule Teams hauled borate deposits 165 miles out of Death Valley to a rail station in Mojave. An entry tunnel was built, and the rail track was laid in a loop. Because modern freight trains are often more than a mile long, the locomotive will pass over the final cars in its own train.
